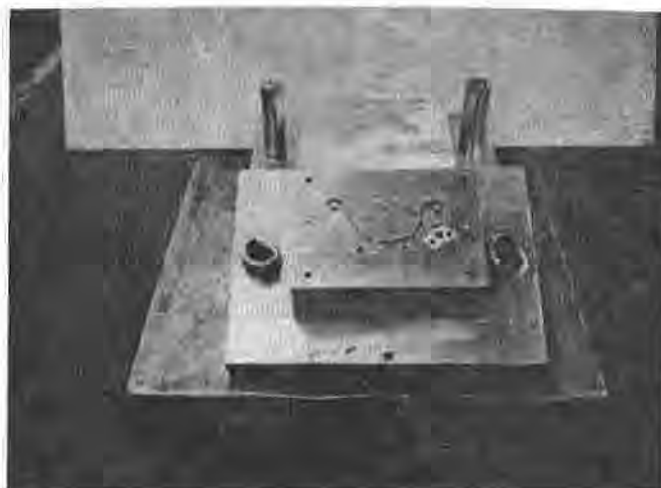

The picture above WAS a sparkling new die for blanking piece parts. It had run only six pieces when it got wrecked. The cost of this die was eighteen hundred eighty two dollars, and now it will take in excess of three hundred dollars of material and labor to repair it, as well as a delay in production. In 1966, we had a total tool maintenance expense of ONE HUNDRED TWELVE THOUSAND FIVE HUNDRED FIFTY ONE DOLLARS and 28 cents. The first six months of this year, it cost us another SIXTY SEVEN THOUSAND, SEVEN HUNDRED FOURTEEN DOLLARS AND FOURTEEN CENTS, making an eighteen month total of \$180,265.78. HORRIFYING, isn't it? Not only that, but the way the pieces "flew" when this die broke up, it is fortunate that someone didn't get hurt.

A mild stir was created this week by a slightly round man who was walking up and down in the hall outside the Personnel Offices carrying a small sign on which were printed the words, "I PROTEST".
