

BOWLING

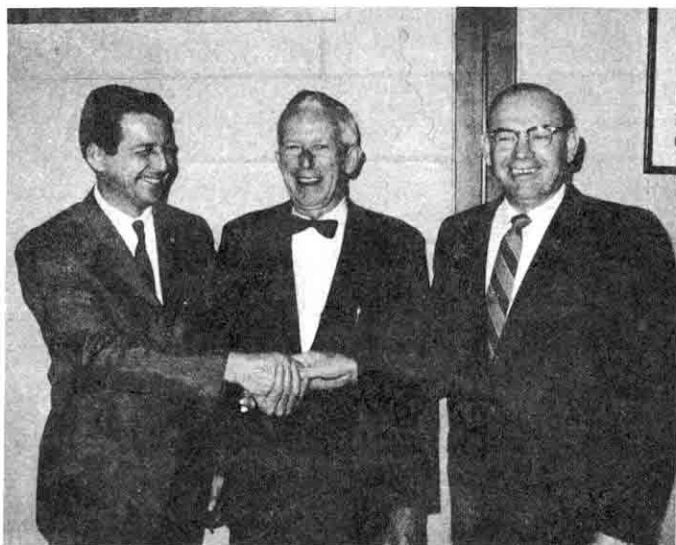
