

COLD DRINKS

Too much iced tea, iced water or other cold drinks can cause a summer sore throat. "What happens is that the prolonged cold cools the throat membranes," explained Dr. James S. Feurig, director of Olin Health Center at Michigan State University. As a result, circulation in the throat membrane slows and the tiny blood and lymph vessels narrow, keeping natural germ-resistant agents from reaching the throat and fighting off germs. Drink cold drinks at intervals instead of one after another, advises Dr. Feurig. This allows the throat to return to normal body temperatures and build up its defenses. (This means beer - unless someone else is buying.)
