SHOEMOBILE

Employees will be interested to know that the Safety Shoemobile will be here in the plant for two days next week; Thursday, Oct. 12 and Friday, Oct. 13 from 8 AM to 5 PM each day. Older employees are already familiar with the process, but for new employees we will spell it out.

The Midwest Safety Shoe Company, a subsidiary of Hi Test provides safety shoes, both work and dress types, at a very nominal price to Roper Bradley employees. In addition, the Company pays \$4.00 of the price of each pair of shoes purchased - the limit is two pairs per employee. Also the purchases may be paid for by payroll deduction with one, two or three deductions as desired. Samples of the shoes available are on display in the D/15 and D/35 canteen areas.

Expert fitters will be available in the Shoemobile and employees are asked to check with their foreman as to when they visit the unit, which will be parked right next to the North Guard House.
