June, the traditional month of weddings is "bustin out all over again" and we congratulate the following newly married couples; Assembly being the home dept. of all three new husbands:

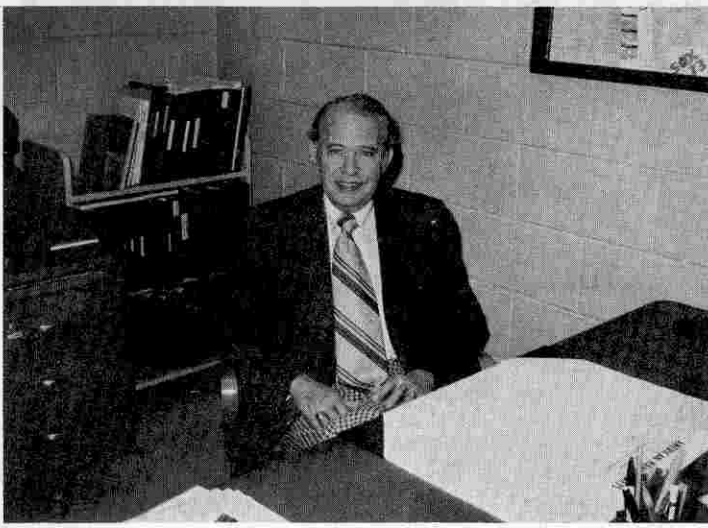
