OLD TIMER OF THE WEEK

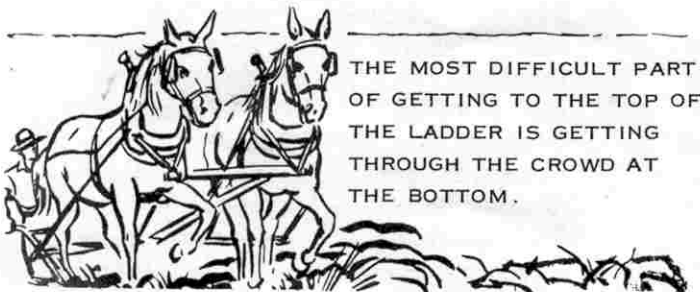
This week's honored employee is LOUIS STEFANICH, who has to be considered one of the most dedicated, hard working and conscientious supervisors at Bradley. LOUIE came here to work right after graduation from Bradley High School on June 4, 1937 and this has been the only place he has ever worked. He started in the Sickie Dept., a part of what is now the Forge Shop where he worked for the late Camille Riberdy. Except for a short span on the Shell Line during the war, the rest of his factory tenure was in Assembly where he made Foreman in 1956. He was promoted to General Foreman in 1966, and in 1971 was named Division Superintendent, a post he holds at the present time.

During World War II LOUIE spent two years in the Navy, most of which time was spent in the Pacific with the Amphibious Forces. He was involved in the landings at Iwo Jima and Okinawa and also saw service on Saipan and in the Philippines.

LOUIE and his wife Thelma have been married 33 years and have two married daughters, Barbara and Rose, both of whom formerly worked here in Purchasing. Thelma is employed at St. Mary's Hospital and the couple have four grandchildren.

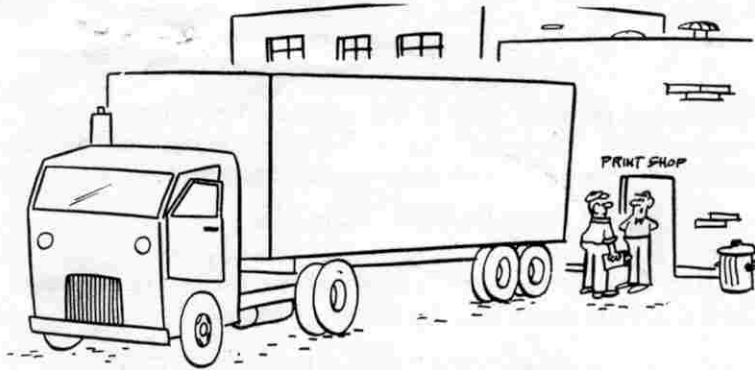
GOLF LEAGUE
