Congratulations to ROBERT HARTUNG D/15 who was married on April 26, to Donna Howell.

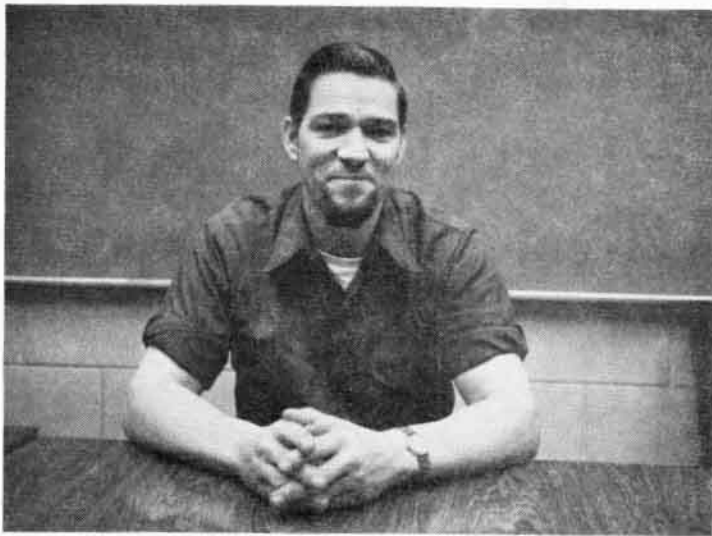
