It was announced last week that two Roper Foundation Special four year scholarships have been awarded to the daughters of our employees. Pictured in the office of PRESIDENT ROBERT PATTERSON are Mr. and Mrs. WILLIAM BERNS and their daughter MICHELE, MR. PATTERSON, NANCY WEBSTER, and her parents Mr. and Mrs. VINCE WEBSTER.

MICHELE BERNS is a senior at Clifton Central High School and ranks number one in a graduating class of 126 with a grade point average of 4.933 out of a possible 5. In addition to her scholastic accomplishments she is also active in Band, Chorus, Dramatics, G.A.A., Annual Staff and National Honor Society. She plans to attend Olivet College and work for a degree in Nursing. Her proud dad BILL is an order packer in Repair Parts. MICHELE'S older brother JOHN received a similar Roper Scholarship in 1974.
