HISTORY OF BRADLEY HIGH SCHOOL

While the first school district for this territory was not organized until 1893, the public school for the present Bradley was located in Bourbonnais. In 1890 a private school was conducted here by Mr. A. Seaman. Following the platting of North Kankakee in 1891 the school district followed and in 1895 became what is now the present Bradley School district.

The first school building of this district was constructed in 1894 as a unit of our present school. Prior to that time school was conducted in an old store building on South Washington Ave; later in the Methodist Church and the Woodman Building. In 1898 the first frame school building was re-modeled.

In 1911 an adjoining brick building was constructed and in 1913 was increased to its present size.

The first high school was established in 1896 by Professor Sutton but was discontinued in 1903. Established again in 1909 by Professor Hartleb there was a graduating class of two students. The enrollment steadily increased to its all time high of 203 of 1941.

The scholastic standing and curriculum also steadily increased so that now it is on a parity with schools that are much larger and better equipped. It is hoped that a new district school will be constructed soon consisting of the most modern buildings.

The athletic achievement of the various school teams in both basket and football has been outstanding and the trophy cases are crowded. Track and baseball teams have also made their mark.

The Bradley School has always been fortunate in securing a superior faculty that has advanced the school to its present scholastic standing, and for the first time in the history of Kankakee County one of its members has been chosen as County Superintendent of Schools.

The student body of today as well as those of the past are also to be complimented. All are children of working parents who realize the necessity for better education and have made many sacrifices to attain this goal.
