

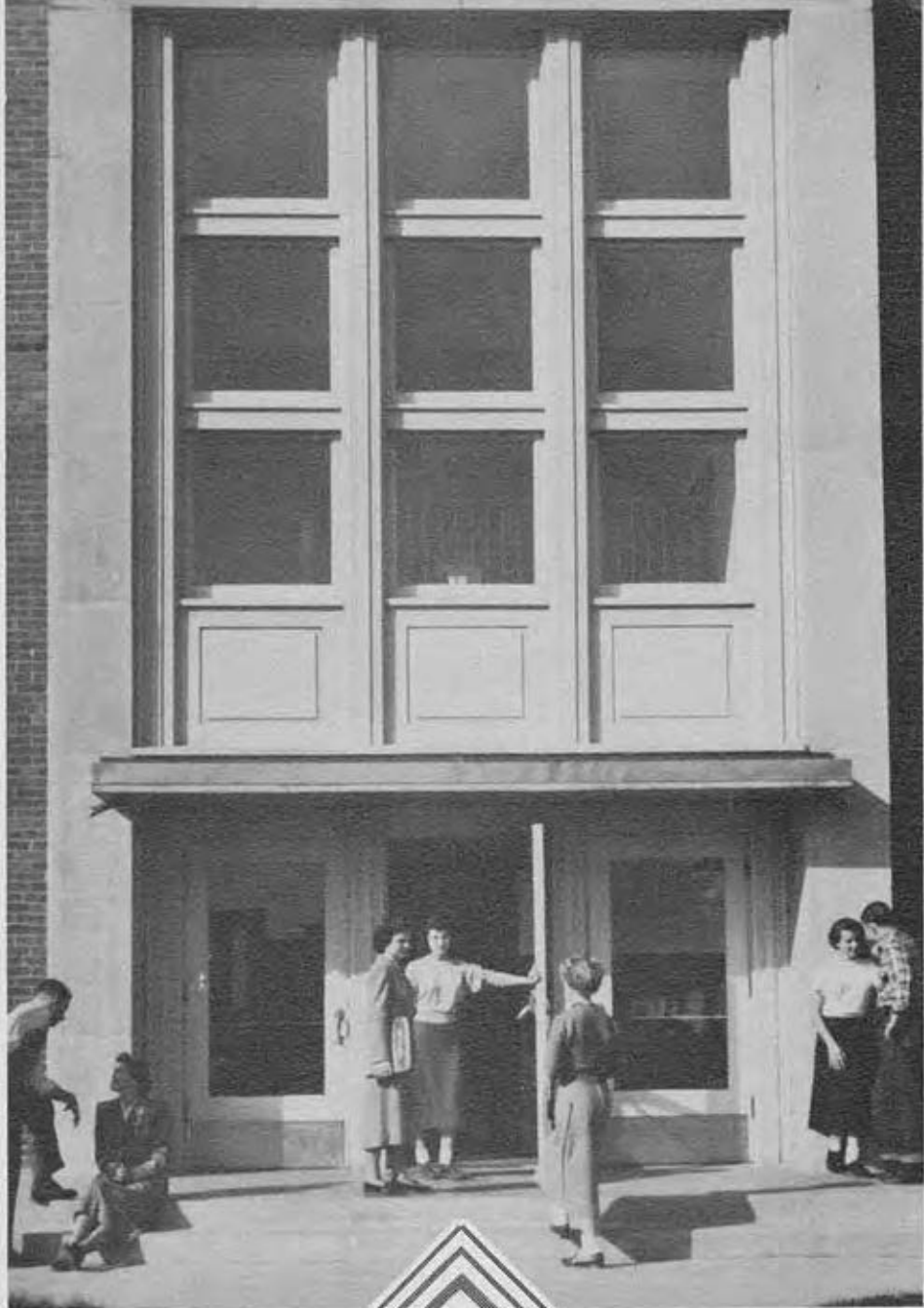

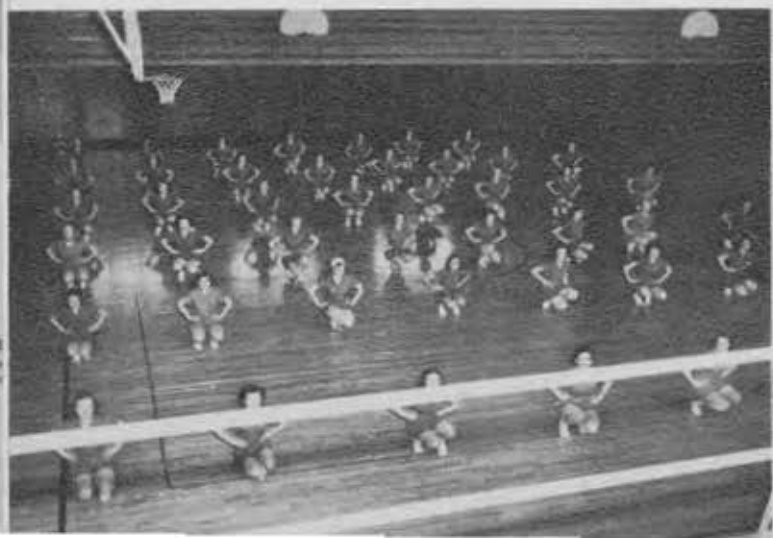
OUR SCHOOL

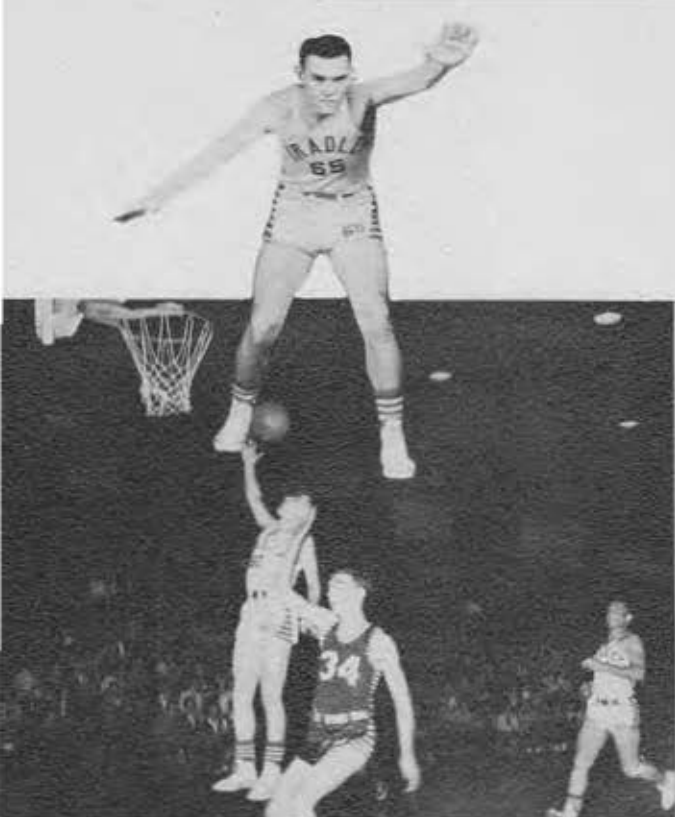
