


SHE IS NOT DEAD

She is not dead—she is just away.


FOREWORD




The Senior Class presented a three-act comedy, "Father of the Bride," on November 18 and 19 at the gym. This year there was a special student matinee on the previous afternoon.

To the strains of "Goodnight Sweetheart" the guests departed with pleasant memories of their evening of "Ebbtide."








BATON TWIRLERS





VARSITY BASKETBALL TEAM

Bradley went to Crete for a heart-breaking loss 50-46. We were hosts to Gilman winning that game 85-71.






